Minutes of Regular Meeting October 14, 2015

The Meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by Chairman Woehrle.

Motion/ Murray, 2^{nd /} Daly: To approve the minutes of the September 9, 2015 regular monthly meeting minutes as amended. Passed 3-0.

Motion/ Murray, 2nd/ Daly: To pay bills for corresponding check #'s 14769 – 14799 and check #'s 14800-14824 From September 10, 2015 thru October 14, 2015 totaling \$75,585.90 as reviewed. Passed 3-0.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

- The reserve accounts as of the end of September were reviewed.
- The Building Addition/Renovation funds are completely expended and no further reports will occur.
- The comparison sheets for September 2014 vs.2015 were reviewed.

- Budget versus actual expenses through September 2015 were reviewed. We are 75% through the year and we have spent 77% of the budget.
- A bond redemption payment was made in the sum of \$295,000.00
- Chief Lingenfelter and I are still working on the 2016 budget. Right now we are at a 4.5% tax levy. Some hurdles include contractual salary increases and paramedic stipends. In addition, workers compensation will be seeing at 20-22% increase due to future injury experience modification.

• I have reviewed the LOSAP program and find no major flaws with the current document draft.

APPARATUS & EQUIPMENT:

Chief Lingenfelter Reported:

- New engine specifications have been reviewed and working with vendor on updating and obtaining an updated price. Request board authorization for a permissive referendum to utilize up to \$550,000.00 for the purchase of an Engine and associated equipment.
- Body repair to U-421 has been scheduled for later this month with Frank & Sons.
- Ambulance 941 had the DEF system repaired. Fuel conditioner was accidentally added to the DEF tank resulting in damage to the system. Repairs were \$1,498.00.
- Truck 405 sustained damage to the body during training last Monday. The cost to repair is \$2,571.00. The truck is still in service. Repairs are tentatively scheduled for the week of October 26th pending board approval.
- Annual preventive maintenance of pumps and fire apparatus chassis is scheduled for this month.

Chief Lingenfelter Reported:

• Our current 2G modems will not function after early 2016 due to changes in cellular service availability. <u>I am requesting authorization to purchase three replacement 3G modems for the LP12 cardiac monitors at a cost not to exceed \$2,300.00.</u>

Chief Lingenfelter Reported:

- Spectrum Environmental Associates has been contracted to compete the asbestos testing on the roof at the River Road station. Samples were taken this afternoon. Anticipate results in one week's time.
- Fluorescent lighting in Balltown Road station apparatus bay has been re-lamped.
- Flagpole lights at Balltown Road have been replaced.
- Wood paneling has been installed below the bail-out window to limit wear and tear on the building and enhance training safety.
- LED driver units on exterior lights over apparatus bays have changed out with the updated drivers received from the fixture manufacturer.

- There is a leak in the GBFC kitchen sink.
- The window in the GBFC kitchen does not have a screen for the window. Since the fire company was authorized to replace that window, the responsibility for a screen falls on the GBFC.

• On Monday, October 12th, personnel from NFD 1 participated in live fire training with the GE Global Research Center's fire brigade at Saratoga County's fire training center.

Chief Dietrich Reported:

- I recently took and ICS Safety Officer class recently and found that listening to other people from departments as a good source of information.
- With Volunteer number of interior firefighters dwindling I am asking the Commissioners to seriously considering hiring Career Firefighter/Paramedic's to fill the void. The NFPA recommends a 2- in, 2 out approach to firefighting. This does not occur in this district, with only 9 interior firefighters and losing 2 of them very soon.
